Whitney Root

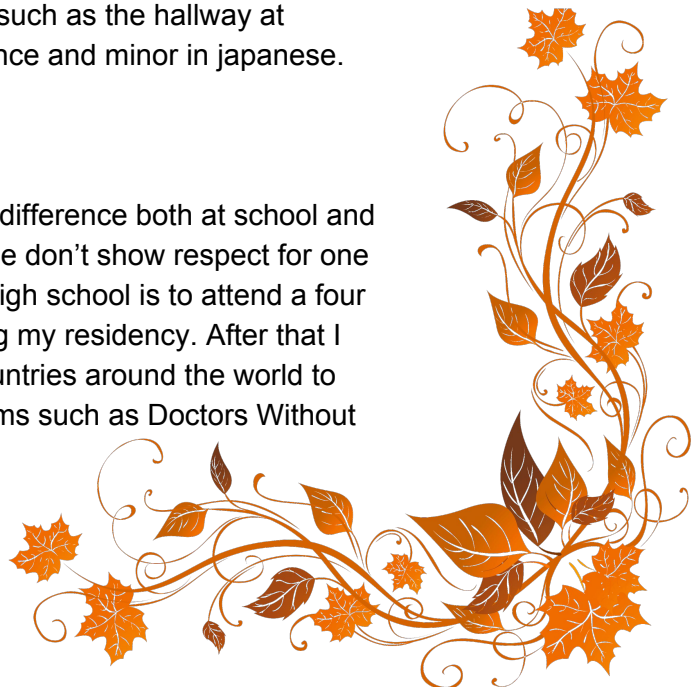
